Background Summary

Molly Hutchinson was born on 2 October 1870 in Madison County, Indiana to Francis Hutchinson and Maggie (also known as Margaret) (Bowen) Hutchinson. Molly, age 19, married James Games, age 33, in Boone County, Indiana on 25 December 1889, a first marriage for both. Molly and James were parents to nine children who survived infancy: Omer Grover, Alonzo Harrison, James Arthur, Mary Alice, Charles Floyd, Cora Marie, Chester Edwin, Osa Belle, and Elsie. The family, initially recorded as residing in Gregg, Morgan, Indiana in 1900, moved across various counties within Indiana. Molly (Hutchinson) Games is consistently listed in every applicable census record from 1880 to 1950.

Research Notes

Indiana Death Certificate

Molly May Games, aged 85, died on October 16, 1955, at her residence near Bridgeport, a small village in Wayne Township, Marion County, Indiana.⁴ The death certificate identifies her as widowed and a housewife, and notably states "none" in the field for a Social Security number. Her father is listed as W. Henry Hutchison, while her mother's maiden name is unknown. The Moore & Kirk Funeral Home arranged her body's transfer to East Maplewood Cemetery in Anderson, Indiana. Her son, A. H. Games, who resided at the same address, served as the informant for the death certificate. The primary cause of death was pneumonia, with influenza as the underlying cause. (See EXHIBIT 1.)

Analysis: Exhibit 1 presents a digital copy of an original death certificate obtained from Ancestry.com. This death certificate offers both primary and secondary information. Details such as the date and location of Molly Games' death, the funeral home, type of release, and cemetery name and location were documented by eyewitnesses. Historical information was provided by Molly's son, A.H. Games. However, since A.H. Games did not possess first-hand knowledge about his mother's birth details or parents, the information he provided is secondary. Consequently, he mistakenly identified the wrong man as Molly's father and did not know her mother's name.

Further evidence from the 1880 U.S. Census lists a young girl named Mary, of an age consistent with Molly, living in a household with parents named Francis Hutchinson and Margaret.⁵ Additionally, Molly's marriage record, as previously noted, identifies her father as Francis Hutchison. This consistency between the census and the marriage record reinforces the likelihood that Francis is Molly's actual father, casting doubt on the accuracy of the death certificate's informant.

Obituary

A transcription of Molly Games' obituary found on *Newspapers.com* follows.⁶ (See EXHIBIT 2.)

Molly M. Games

Molly May Games, 85, will be buried in East Maplewood Cemetery after services at 1 p.m. tomorrow in Moore & Kirk Ben Davis Chapel. She died Sunday in her home near Bridgeport. Born at Fayette, Mrs. Games had lived here 19 years. Survivors are four daughters, Mary Cline, South Bend; Mary Phillips, Martinsville; Elise Beason, Anderson, and Belle Piel, Indianapolis; four sons, Alonzo H. Games, Bridgeport; Arthur and Chester Games, South Bend, and Charles Games, Laporte; 28 grandchildren and 14 great-grandchildren.

Analysis: Exhibit 2 features a digital image of Molly Games' obituary, an original source obtained from Newspapers.com, originating from an Indiana newspaper. This obituary includes both primary and secondary information from an unidentified source. Published in The Indianapolis News on Tuesday, 18 October 1955, the obituary places her death on the previous Sunday, consistent with the 16th of October death date on the death certificate. It verifies her burial at East Maplewood Cemetery and names Moore & Kirk as the funeral service provider, corroborating the information on the death certificate. The obituary also recognizes a surviving son, Alonzo H. Games of Bridgeport, who corresponds to

the informant, A.H. Games, on the death certificate. The obituary does not provide details on Molly's husband, parents, siblings, or her date of birth.

Diagram of Burial Plot and Cemetery Map

The diagram depicting Mollie May Games' burial plot features a marked representation of her grave, circled in red, along with eleven additional plots.⁷ Of these, nine are filled and three remain vacant. Handwritten notations within the rectangles provide identification for each interred individual. Mollie's surname appears overwritten with the correct version written above. Next to Mollie's plot is her son Omer's grave; his surname is corrected from an initial erroneous entry of "Garnes." The timespan of burials in this section ranges from as early as 1944 to as recent as 2010. The cemetery map serves as a visual aid providing context for Molly's burial location within the layout of Maplewood Cemetery.⁸ (See EXHIBITS 3 and 4.)

Analysis: Exhibits 3 and 4 include a diagram of Mollie May Games' burial plot and a map of East Maplewood Cemetery (now called Maplewood Cemetery) located at 200 College Drive, Anderson, Indiana. These are original sources, received via email from the cemetery staff. The diagram, undated and with the artist unknown, provides primary information confirming Molly Games' burial at this location on October 19, 1955 (written in handwriting on the diagram of her plot), which is consistent with the death certificate and obituary information. The map shows the layout of the entire cemetery. Mollie Games burial plot is in Section 25 (although missing from the burial diagram, the section number was confirmed by cemetery staff via email), Lot 175, Space 1, alongside her son, "Omar G." Games. This information aligns with the previous sources, reinforcing the accuracy of the reported date of Molly's death. The cemetery records and the diagram, received directly from cemetery staff, confirm Mollie's burial at Maplewood Cemetery. It should be noted that Mollie's grave lacks a gravestone, as confirmed by cemetery staff.

Analysis: Exhibit 5 features the 1950 U.S. Census, noting the household of Alonzo H. Games in Wayne Township, Marion County, Indiana, recorded on 17 April 1950. The document lists Alonzo, age 55, as the head of the household and Mollie Games, age 79, as his mother. Both individuals correspond with the information on Mollie's death certificate and obituary. The census address, 12 W. Washington Street, adjacent to the village of Bridgeport, aligns with the locations indicated on Mollie's death certificate and obituary. ¹⁰ (See EXHIBIT 6.)

Conclusion

Molly (Hutchinson) Games passed away on 16 October 1955 in Marion County, Indiana. This date is corroborated by original records created in the immediate aftermath of her death – the death certificate and the obituary. Further affirmation comes from the cemetery plot diagram indicating her burial on 19

October 1955, a date also stated in the death certificate and the obituary. The 1950 U.S. Census reveals she was residing with her son, Alonzo H. Games, who is the informant on her death certificate and named as a surviving son in her obituary. This record also validates Mollie's place of residence. No contradictory records indicating a different death date were found during this research.

Further Research Suggestions

Additional research to find more records about Molly (Hutchinson) Games' death date could be conducted by looking for the following:

- **Church Records:** If Molly or her family were associated with a specific church in Wayne Township, Marion County, Indiana, there may be records of her death, funeral, or burial there. There is a list here for Marion County, Indiana, and links to Bridgeport Church Records: <u>LDS Genealogy</u>.
- **Letters or Personal Documents:** If any family papers, letters, diaries, or other documents have been preserved, these might contain references to Molly's death. Contacting DNA matches on Ancestry.com, MyHeritage, FTDNA, 23andme, and FamilySearch may result in some of these documents being available.
- **Probate Records:** If Molly had a will or there was an estate to be settled, there should be Marion County, Indiana probate records filed when she died. These often include death dates and could provide further verification. Contact the Marion County Records Department & Microfilm Library here to order a court record: Request records here.






EXHIBIT 5 - 1950 U.S. CENSUS




EXHIBIT 6 – BRIDGEPORT LOCATION
